Parent Information Meeting

STADD encourages a "one government" approach to collaborative transition planning for youth and young adults between the ages of 16 and 24 years old who are living with developmental disabilities, Autism and/or Fetal Alcohol Syndrome and are eligible for CLBC services.

The STADD Rural and Remote Navigator supports positive transition experiences as youth (and their families) shift from child/youth-serving systems to adult-serving systems. Navigators help facilitate early planning across Ministries and coordinate transition planning to bring together a support team from a variety of service providers to assist individuals and families prepare for adulthood.

The Parent Information Meeting will:

- ✓ Provide an opportunity for the Navigator to introduce themselves and explain their role
- ✓ Give an overview of how STADD can help support youth and young adults with developmental disabilities transitioning to adulthood
- ✓ Provide information on how to access the STADD program and begin working with the Rural and Remote Navigator
- ✓ Answer any questions about Services to Adult with Developmental Disabilities and the Rural and Remote Navigator launch in your community
